2015-16 Artspace Artist-in-Residence Eben Kling presents an installation of new paintings and drawings that takes a hallucinatory journey into the unruly pockets of working class America, exploring that which makes us “human” or “near human.” Humanoids adds to Kling’s growing menagerie of tragic-comedic characters. The project room’s overall paint job—black with a constellation of white dots—suggests a star-gazers’ paradise. Kling will also move and reposition his pieces around the room throughout the show.

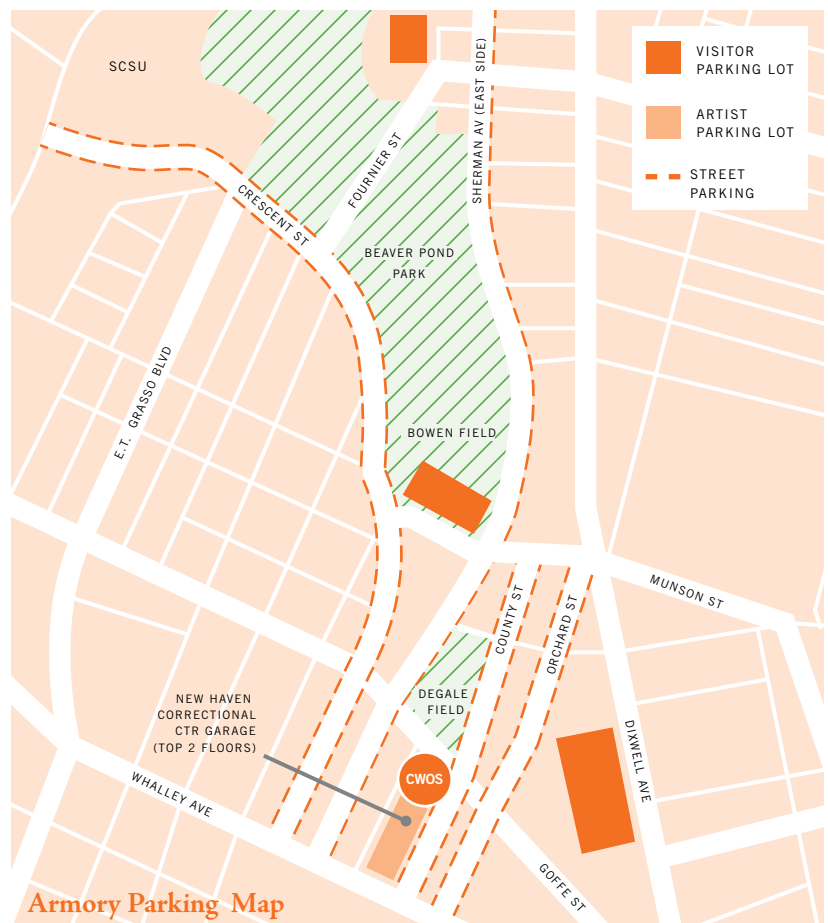

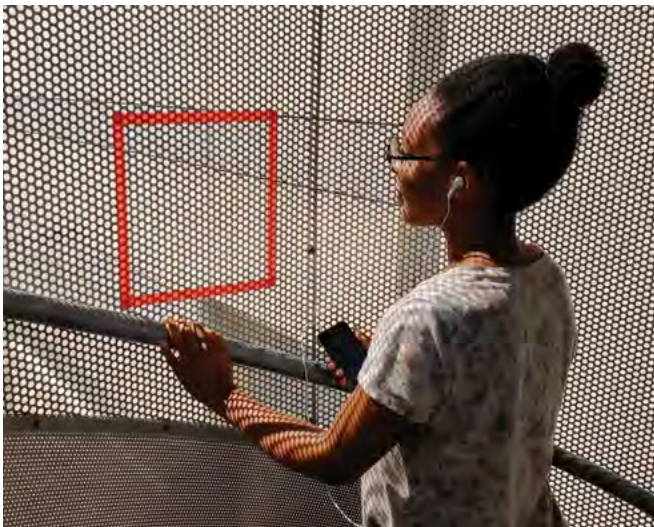
1 **Projet In Situ: La Ronde (The Round)**

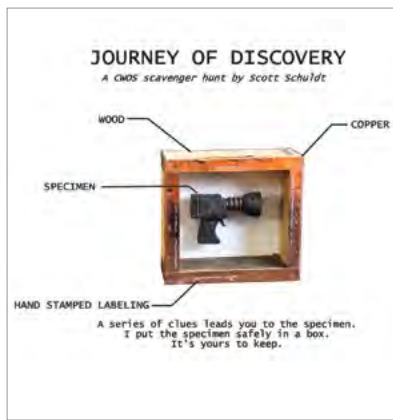

2 **Adam Berkwitt & Phil Lique: Dr. Plinko**

Inspired by *The Price is Right*, Dr. Plinko is a collaboration between physicians and artists that contemplates the absurdity surrounding pricing and profiteering within the American healthcare system. Can that price really be right?

3 **Gordon Skinner : Urban Totems**

A totem is a sacred object that symbolizes a group—be it a family, community, or tribe. This work rethinks the milk crate basketball hoop as a totem for various CWOS communities. Installed around the Armory, each overlooked space becomes an arena for play. Pick up a copy of the Zine at the main entrance.

4 **Christie DeNizio: Competitive Volume**

A nod to David Hammons's altered basketball hoops, Competitive Volume invites visitors to shoot colorful balls into two hoops connected by a 100-foot mesh tube. No one wins, no one scores, no one gets the rebound, but everyone modifies the composition.

5 **Caitlin Foley & Misha Rabinovich: Total Jump**

How in sync are we? This video game trains up to eight people to jump and land at the same time. Participants stand on floor mats with electronic sensors. Could preparing for a world-wide jump help us transcend our divisions?

6 **Megan Craig: The Way Things Felt**

Up to 40 players are invited to create a composition. Pick a suit, choose a colorful shape, enter a 20-foot room covered with black felt, and take on the role of "painter," "eraser," or "surface."

7 **Bob Gregson & Melanie Carr: People Puzzle**

Connecting with others was never so much fun! Don a giant puzzle piece and join puzzle parts with others. Feeling independent? Build a new structure!

A new job to unwork at is an exhibition and ongoing performative symposium that considers the role of work as a social, material, and economic concept, crucial in shaping our identity and reality. The selected artists contemplate this notion, while examining cultural production and its position in a larger system of labor relations, inherently connected to current social and political movements. The inclusion of video, writing, activism, and performance provides an alternative means to understand what labor means in a field increasingly dominated by freelance culture and entrepreneurial values.

An early iteration of this exhibition was presented at Los Angeles Contemporary Exhibitions (LACE); for the Artspace version, the curators are especially interested in foregrounding labor-related issues unfolding in the New Haven and Yale community.
